SUBJECT: Faculty Senate Legislation #84010(B) -
Establishment of a School of Communication

The Faculty Senate, at its meeting of November 5, 1984, voted to approve Faculty Senate Legislation #84010(B) - Establishment of a School of Communication. The text of the legislation is as follows:

A School of Communication is hereby established, as defined in Section 2.3 of the Charter of Faculty Government. The structure of the school will be subsequently determined by legislation.

The School shall be authorized to award the degrees of Bachelor of Science in Communication and Bachelor of Fine Arts in Communication, and to offer programs in fulfillment of the requirements for the Master of Arts degree awarded by the Graduate School. All candidates for the degrees of Bachelor of Science in Communication and Bachelor of Fine Arts in Communication must successfully complete all requirements for a major in a department or other program within the College of Arts and Sciences. In addition, such candidates must successfully complete at least 66 credits of work within the College, inclusive of the major, and appropriately distributed.

The effective date of implementation of this legislation is June 1, 1985. All students properly enrolled as majors in the Department of Communication as of May 31, 1985, and all students so enrolled who are on leave of absence granted by the College of Arts and Sciences, shall be transferred to the School of Communication. The award of degrees for students so affected shall be in accordance with the requirements stated in the University Bulletin at the time of their first enrollment in the University, and shall be made by the faculty of the College of Arts and Sciences upon the recommendation of the College and of the School of Communication. In lieu of the foregoing, any student transferred to the School of Communication as provided above may elect to receive a degree offered by the School upon satisfaction of the requirements herein stated and stated in the Bulletin of the School.

The foregoing provisions may not be altered without the consent of the President of the University and the Faculty Senate, as stipulated in By-law 1.5 of the Faculty Manual.

This legislation is now forwarded to you for your action.
