Personal Hardship Extension of Probationary Period

The Faculty Senate, at its meeting of April 6, voted to approve Faculty Senate Legislation #91009(B) - Personal Hardship Extension of Probationary Period. The text of the legislation is as follows:

As provided in Faculty Policy 3.6.3, untenured members of the Regular Faculty may request an extension of the probationary period for reasons of extraordinary personal hardship. A written request for such extension shall be filed with the Chair no later than the last year prior to the year in which a tenure determination must otherwise be made. The request must be accompanied by a written statement by the faculty member giving a concise description of the nature and severity of the hardship. The request shall be forwarded through the Chair and Dean to the President for final determination.

This legislation is now forwarded to you for your action.

I approve this recommendation, effective beginning with the spring semester of the 1982-1983 academic year:

"A student is in good academic standing only if his cumulative grade point average is higher than that established for the determination of academic probation.

A student must be in good academic standing in order to represent the University in extracurricular activities."\*

My reasons are summarized briefly below.

I believe this action to be important as clarification, but also as emphasis of a fundamentally important principle. The policy concerning eligibility for participation in demanding, extracurricular activities by students representing the University apparently has not been fully articulated. In practice, I am informed, our students have been allowed to participate in non-academic pursuits sponsored by the University, regardless of their academic jeopardy.

<sup>\*</sup> I understand "represent" to mean any student activity undertaken in the name of and approved by the University which requires a significant time commitment. This definition clearly includes any intercollegiate competition or representation. It may include other extracurricular activities, to be determined by the Provost as may be appropriate.
