Requirements for Graduation with Honors

(Amendment to Faculty Senate Legislation #83034(B))

The Faculty Senate, at its meeting of March 21, 1994, voted to approve Faculty Senate Legislation #93005(B) - Amendment to Faculty Senate Legislation #83034(B) - Requirements for Graduation with Honors. The text of the legislation is as follows:

"The Office of Enrollment Services shall be responsible for setting reasonable dates for the submission of names of students who have earned <u>magna</u> or <u>summa cum laude</u> and other matters pertaining to the implementation of this policy.

With advice of the Faculty Senate, the Provost shall select a University committee charged with judging student theses and projects recommended by departmental or school committees. The committee shall also act in an advisory capacity to the Honors Program concerning issues raised by the Director of the Honors Program or by individual faculty members or students. This committee shall be known as the Honors Advisory Committee and shall consist of one representative from each school engaged in undergraduate instruction and one representative each from the humanities, arts, natural sciences, and social sciences of the College of Arts and Sciences."
