The General Education Requirements and Curriculum Committee met on November 9, 1994. The committee members attending the meeting were Peter Bellis, Jan Hochstin, John Stewart, Peter Tarjan, and John Masterson. The committee discussed the possible addition of two musicology courses, MCY 131 and MCY 132, to the Arts section of the master list of courses to be used for areas of knowledge requirements. The recommendation of the committee is that those courses be added to the list. The committee also discussed other matters, including the writing requirement. The recommendation of the committee is that Faculty Senate Legislation #87023 (establishing the writing requirement) be amended to require 4 courses (1992-1997) and 5 courses (Fall, 1997) in place of the current language requiring 12 credits (1990-1995) and 15 credits (Fall, 1995). (A copy of the proposed amendment is attached.) Various additional issues related to the writing requirement were also raised, and the committee will meet again to discuss them further. It is possible that we will recommend more revisions to the current formulation of the requirements. A major problem is that not enough writing courses are available to our students. It is not clear whether this problem can be addressed by any simple reformulation of the requirements.
