Subject: Faculty Senate Legislation #2001-07(B) – Addition to the Charge of the Committee on Professional Conduct (Section B4.10 of the Faculty Manual)

The Faculty Senate, at its 28 November 2001 meeting, voted unanimously to approve the following addition to the charge of the Committee on Professional Conduct, section B4.10 of the Faculty Manual, to give specific notice that frivolous or malicious actions in alleging unprofessional conduct are themselves unprofessional.

If the Committee on Professional Conduct, in the course of its deliberations, has reason to believe that a faculty member acting as complainant or witness has knowingly introduced evidence that has been fabricated or has knowingly given false testimony, the Committee may recommend that a charge of unprofessional conduct be brought against the individual. If the Committee has reason to believe that a person who is not a faculty member has done so, the Committee may report its view to an appropriate administrator.
