Subject: Faculty Senate Legislation #2005-16(B) – Elimination of restriction of the required second major, for students in the School of Communication, to those within Arts and Sciences

The Faculty Senate, at its April 26, 2006 meeting, voted to approve a request from the School of Communication to lift the restriction of the required second major to those within the College of Arts and Sciences as follows:

- 1) The School of Communication be permitted to continue to require the completion of a second major outside of its school, but that that major not be restricted to majors currently with the College of Arts and Sciences.
- 2) Student will be free to choose their required second major from any curricular area for which they qualify and to which they are admitted under the requirements of that second major. The remaining courses to total the 120 credits required for graduation will be taken in the College of Arts and Sciences.


