## Proposal for the governance of Interschool Interdepartmental Master's (IIM) Degree Programs

This proposal deals with the issue of governance of Interschool Interdepartmental Master's (IIM) degree programs that involve faculty from two or more schools or colleges. This proposal does not deal with the establishment of such programs; the process of establishing new IIM degree programs shall follow the existing policies for the establishment of all new degree programs.

IIM degree programs that span more than one school require special policies concerning oversight. Such programs do not fit within the normal structure of a degree program run by the faculty in a department or school or college, overseen by a chairperson, and reporting to school-level committees or councils under a single dean. As such policy is hereby established by the School Council to be submitted to the Faculty Senate for approval to establish the following process to oversee IIM Programs.

- 1. A Steering Committee is to be established and composed of faculty from each of the schools or colleges involved in each IIM program. As each IIM program is uniquely configured, the appropriate size of the Steering Committee will vary. A minimum size of five faculty members from the IIM program teaching faculty shall be established. The actual Steering Committee membership will be determined by the School Councils of the Academic Schools or Colleges involved, after consultation with the Dean of the Graduate School. As stated earlier membership of the steering committee shall be made up of IIM program teaching faculty. Criteria for the degree will be decided upon the creation of such program.
- 2. A Director of each IIM program is to be named to oversee the IIM program and its Steering Committee. The Director is appointed by the Provost after consultation with the Deans of the involved Schools and/or Colleges. The Director shall be subject to Program faculty review every four years.
- 3. The Program and its Director will report to the appropriate Graduate School Committee for IIMs. These Graduate School Committees will be appointed by the Dean of the Graduate School with members serving three year staggered terms. This Graduate School Committee will serve as the equivalent to School-level or College-level committees. It is expected that, as new IIM programs develop, the Graduate School will appoint appropriate oversight committees with each Committee having jurisdiction over a broad academic area, e.g. Social, Behavioral, and Economic Science or Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, etc.

# September 27, 2006 Faculty Senate Minutes

The meeting, held in the Seminar Room at the Rosenstiel Campus, opened at 3:30 p.m.

#### **CHAIR'S REMARKS**

As indicated in his memorandum to Senators, the Chair noted that there had been several losses to the University family over the summer: Robert Kelley from the Department of Mathematics, Tony Elfouhaily from the Rosenstiel campus, and Pam Murfin, wife of Ross Murfin, former Professor of English and Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. A moment of silence was held. The Chair also reminded Senators that some of the items that come before the Senate are complex and/or even contentious and asked that discussion be focused on the issue before the body; that Senators avoid bringing in concerns that are only tangential to that issue, and that Senators speak to an issue only if they have something new to add. The Chair expressed the apologies of the second Vice Chair, Sharyn Ladner, for her absence because she was attending her professional society meeting.

#### PROVOST'S REMARKS

The Provost spoke in place of the President, who was not able to attend due to a long-standing commitment that was scheduled a year ago. The Provost presented a number of items.

- The University received an anonymous gift for the Momentum Campaign that will fund five professorships, four in the College of Arts and Sciences and one in the School of Architecture: The new Distinguished Professors are: Dr. Chuck Carver, Distinguished Professor of Psychology in the College of Arts and Sciences; Dr. David Ellison, Distinguished Professor in the Humanities in the College of Arts and Sciences; Dr. Howard Gordon, Distinguished Professor of Physics in the College of Arts and Sciences; Dr. Susan Haack, Distinguished Professor in the Humanities in the College of Arts and Sciences; and Dean Elizabeth Plater-Zyberk, Distinguished Professor of Architecture. Also, Nobel Prize winner Andrew Schally has joined the University and received a Distinguished Professorship from the generous gift of the Miller family.
- The Shared Appreciation Mortgage Plan has been implemented. For questions regarding this program, contact Mark Diaz, Associate Vice President of Budget and Planning.
- As of September 1, 2006, wireless capability is available to all faculty, students, and staff on the Coral Gables campus.
- There will be number of searches held for senior positions: William Hipp, Dean of the Frost School of Music, announced that he is stepping down; Steven Ullmann is stepping down as Dean of the Graduate School to focus on his duties as Vice Provost for Faculty Affairs; Lewis Temares is stepping down as the Dean of the College of Engineering to focus on his role as Vice President of Information Technology; and Dean Paul Sugrue is stepping down as Dean of the School of Business.
- Freshman class enrollment update: Last fall we overenrolled (2,272 in a model that wanted 2,089). This year we enrolled almost on target (2,054 in a model that wanted no more than 2,000). We are expecting a 7-10 point increase in the SATs. We have reached a record high proportion (67%) of the class that has come from the top 10% of their high schools. The gender balance is comparable to the previous year (52% female to 48% male). The underrepresented minority statistics are comparable to past years (9-10% African American; low side of 20% Hispanic). Our discount rate is comparable to past years (30% overall and around 35% for freshmen). We have gone from an 82% freshmen retention rate to an 89% retention rate.

- In the *US News* ranking we moved from 55 to 54, representing an improvement of 12 places since 2001.
- The strategic planning process is in place and the goal is to exhibit the educational and research characteristics of the 26 private universities in the AAU within the next decade. In April, the Board of Trustees will be presented with a plan outlining how this goal can be achieved. The Provost entertained questions from the floor.

#### APPROVAL OF TODAY'S AGENDA

The meeting agenda passed unanimously.

# RESOLUTION PERTAINING TO THE ADMINISTRATION'S HANDLING OF STUDENT DISCIPLINE RE: JANITORS' STRIKE

Roger Kanet, Senator for the College of Arts and Sciences, presented a resolution pertaining to the administration's handling of student discipline regarding the janitors' strike. He indicated that the resolution does not judge the appropriateness or inappropriateness of the students' activities but the administration's handling of the situation and the procedures followed. *The Senate voted unanimously to adopt the resolution.* The Chair of the Senate asked the Secretary of the Senate to read a written response from the President since she was unable to attend this meeting. After discussion, it was recommended that this issue be brought up as a matter of discussion at the next meeting when the President is present.

#### INTRODUCTION OF RICARDO HALL, DEAN OF STUDENTS

Ricardo Hall, Dean of Students, introduced himself to the Senate and shared his plans for his new position. He explained that the Office of the Dean of Students is responsible for fraternity and sorority affairs, alcohol and drug education, judicial affairs, the Honor Council, and the Chaplains Association. The office is involved in crisis response for the University and community relations. There is a licensed clinical social worker employed in that office, making UM one of the few institutions in the country that has a full-time case manager. After sharing some of his experiences and observations at the University, he explained that there is an ad hoc Committee in place to review the Student Rights and Responsibilities Handbook. The Committee charge is a broad review of the University's policies and the review of specific concerns that have been voiced by the faculty. There will most likely be major revisions to the Undergraduate Student Handbook.

#### **UPCOMING HEALTH CARE PLAN**

Steven Ullmann, Vice Provost for University Administration and Faculty Affairs, gave a presentation regarding the comparison of the 2004-2006 and 2007 health care benefits and discussed the options available during the upcoming open enrollment period. William Walsh, Executive Director of Benefits Administration, and Laurence Deets, Consultant from Butler, Buckley, and Deets, Inc., answered questions. The Chair of the Senate informed the Senate that he has asked the Senate's Budget and Compensation Committee to work with the administration to come up with some type of protocol to allow us earlier input into the creation of new plans than has been available in the past.

#### **UPDATE ON SACS ACCREDITATION 2008**

Andy Gomez, Chair of the SACS accreditation team, gave an update to the Senate. Information on SACS can be found at <a href="http://sacs.miami.edu/portal/site/sacs">http://sacs.miami.edu/portal/site/sacs</a>. He stated that a committee has been appointed that includes faculty to start deliberations on the Quality Enhancement Plan

(QEP). The goal is to finish a draft by March 17, 2007, and to make it available to faculty. The outside review will take place March 25-27, 2008.

#### FACULTY PARENTAL LEAVE POLICY

The Chair informed the Senate that the <u>proposed</u> Parental Leave Policy was approved by the General Welfare Committee with the understanding that special arrangements may be made in the policy with individuals in certain circumstances. Steven Ullmann, Vice Provost for University Administration and Faculty Affairs, submitted a proposal to include Research Faculty in the Parental Leave Policy. Dr. Ullmann stated that rather than adding the Research Faculty as an addendum to the existing policy, it made more sense to rewrite the policy incorporating Research Faculty into the language associated with all faculty at the University. After discussion of the proposal the Senate voted by a majority to approve the proposal. A motion was made and seconded to have the proposal become effective immediately. The motion was approved unanimously.

# ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INTERSCHOOL/INTERDEPARTMENTAL MASTER'S PROGRAM

Steven Ullmann, Vice Provost for University Administration and Faculty Affairs, presented a proposal to establish an Interschool/Interdepartmental Master's Degree Program, noting that we do not currently have a policy to deal with such programs. The Chair of the Senate pointed out that this is a governance structure that does not set up a specific program but is an oversight structure for programs that cut across schools and colleges. Discussion resulted in the following changes to the proposal, which were accepted by Dr. Ullmann: inclusion of "with members serving three year staggered terms." in item #3 at the end of the second sentence, and addition of "Proposal for the governance of" at the beginning of the title of the proposal. The Senate voted by a majority to approve the proposal with the two additions noted above. A motion was made and seconded to have the proposal become effective immediately. The motion passed unanimously.

#### MAJOR IN CLASSICS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF CLASSICS

John Paul Russo, Interim Chair of the Department of Classics, presented a <u>proposal</u> for the establishment of a major in the Department of Classics. *The Senate voted unanimously* to approve the establishment of the major. *A motion was made and seconded* to have this major become operative in the spring of 2007. *The motion passed unanimously*.

#### NAME CHANGE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FOREIGN LANGUAGES

In absentia, Anne Cruz, Chair of the Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures, submitted a <u>proposal</u> to change the name of the Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures to the Department of Modern Languages and Literatures. The Senate voted unanimously to approve the proposal. A motion was made and seconded to have the name change become effective for the spring of 2007 and that the department be granted the authority to begin using the name as soon as the President approves the legislation. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **CENTER ON HEMISPHERIC STUDIES**

The Chair informed the Senate that the <u>proposal</u> for the Center on Hemispheric Studies was approved by the General Welfare Committee with the understanding that the Advisory Board membership will be rotating. *The Senate voted unanimously* to approve the proposal.

# REVISION OF THE FACULTY MANUAL INCORPORATING CHANGES TO THE PENSION PLAN

When the General Welfare Committee discussed the proposed revision to the Faculty Manual incorporating changes to the pension plan, it was approved with the understanding that the proposal would become effective immediately. Provost LeBlanc submitted the <u>proposed</u> changes to the Senate. After discussion, *the Senate voted by a majority*, with four abstentions, to approve the revision to the Faculty Manual.

# ESTABLISHMENT OF A NON-CLINICAL EDUCATOR TRACK IN THE MILLER SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

William Awad, Senator for the Miller School of Medicine, joined by Robert Warren as interim Chair of the Department of Cell Biology and Anatomy, presented a <u>proposal</u> to establish a non-clinical educator track in that department. Dr. Awad noted that this measure must be evaluated and reapproved before it can be continued beyond five years. Within this time period the School Council will evaluate the program and render a report to the Faculty Senate with a recommendation regarding the continuation of this track. After discussion, *the Senate voted unanimously* to approve the proposal.

#### COMMITTEE ON PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

As required by Faculty Manual section B4.9 ("The Committee on Professional Conduct consists of a panel from five to twelve senior tenured faculty members elected annually by the Faculty Senate"), the Chair presented a <u>proposed</u> list of members. *The Senate voted unanimously* to approve the proposed list.

#### **FACULTY HEARING COMMITTEE**

As required by the Faculty Manual section C15.9 ("The Committee shall be drawn from a standing panel of twenty tenured faculty members elected each year in a manner determined by the Faculty Senate and approved by the President"), the Chair presented a <u>proposed</u> list of members. *The Senate voted unanimously* to approve the proposed list.

# GENERAL WELFARE COMMITTEE ELECTION FOR THE SCHOOLS OF BUSINESS AND EDUCATION

The Chair informed the Senate that at the General Welfare Committee election last April, the Schools of Business and Education resulted in a tie. An election was held to determine who the representatives would be for these two schools. Election results: School of Business-Jonathan West; School of Education-Randall Penfield.

#### OTHER BUSINESS

Eugene Clasby, Chair of the Outstanding Teaching Award Committee, asked senators to assist the Committee by nominating outstanding teachers for this award and asked that they not be discouraged by the nomination process, noting that the Senate office will provide guidance.

# INFORMATION ITEM: FACULTY SENATE STANDING COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS

As required by Faculty Manual section A15.2 ("The Chair shall report the membership of all committees to the Senate"), the Chair presented the list of standing committee members.

Hi Steve!

Just following up on our recent conversation concerning the IIM proposal an potential move of a department from one school to another:

- 1) Re IIM, you said you would write a cover memo that clarifies the confusion I had (and imagine others will as well) about various aspects of the proposal. I'd be happy to look at it and comment before you send it on if you'd like.
- 2) On the question of the move of a department from one school to another, I mentioned that Geography was the most recent example I could think of. In discussing the matter with the Senate staff, we concluded that it is not a good precedent because the legislation explicitly established a department in (then) SIS but did not formally move the department from A & S; in fact, our recollection is that it was handled that way precisely so that if the department ever wanted to come back, it would still exist in the College, though without any faculty (a prescient decision, as it turned out!). For those few years, then, it appears we had a Department of Geography in the College with no faculty.
- So . . . it appears that according to the Manual, to accomplish what we talked about is governed by A4.1 and B1.5:

#### Interschool Interdepartmental Master's (IIM) Degree Proposal

This proposal deals with the issue of governance of Interschool Interdepartmental Master's (IIM) degree programs that involve faculty from two or more schools or colleges. This proposal does not deal with the establishment of such programs; the process of establishing new IIM degree programs should follow the existing policies for the establishment of all new degree programs.

IIM degree programs that span more than one school require special policies concerning oversight. Such programs do not fit within the normal structure of a degree program run by the faculty in a department or school or college, overseen by a chairperson, and reporting to school-level committees or councils under a single dean. As such policy is hereby established by the Graduate Council to be submitted to the Faculty Senate for approval to establish the following process to oversee IIM Programs.

- 1. A Steering Committee is to be established composed of faculty from each of the schools or colleges involved in the IIM program. Criteria for the degree will be decided upon the creation of such program.
- 2. A Director of the IIM program is to be named to oversee the IIM program and it's Steering Committee.
  The Director is appointed by The Provost after consultation with the Deans of the involved Schools and/or Colleges.
- 3. The Program and its Director will report to the appropriate Graduate School Committee for IIMs.

  These Graduate School Committees will be appointed by the Dean of the Graduate School. This Graduate School Committee will serve as the equivalent to School-level or College-level committees. It is expected that, as new IIM programs develop, the Graduate School will appoint appropriate oversight committees with each Committee having jurisdiction over a broad academic area, e.g. Social, Behavioral, and Economic Science or Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, etc.

#### MINUTES OF THE FACULTY SENATE

At a regular meeting of the Faculty Senate, held in Brockway Lecture Hall, on Monday afternoon, April 23, 1973, the Chairman asked for any corrections to the minutes of the previous meeting. The minutes were approved as printed. Twenty-seven members were present. Also present were President Stanford, Dr. Carl E.B. McKenry, Dr. Sidney Besvinick and Dr. John A. Harrison.

#### #73011 Faculty Senate Liaison to the Student Senate

Motion was made and seconded to adopt as a Class D action the recommendation of the Senate Council to have a Faculty Senate liaison to the Student Senate with full speaking rights in meetings of the Student Senate, or its committees and commissions and full rights to propose motions of a substantive or procedural nature. Motion passed unanimously.

## #73012 Student Representatives on the Faculty Senate

Motion was made and seconded to adopt as Class B legislation the recommendation of the Senate Council as follows:

One student selected by the Graduate Student Association and two students selected by the Undergraduate Student Body Government shall have full speaking privileges and the right to make motions from the floor of the Senate, but shall have no voting rights.

Motion passed unanimously.

This legislation will become Bylaw 2.8 under section II. Meetings, on page 50 of the Faculty Manual.

## #70013 Patent and Copyright Policy Amendment

Motion was made and seconded to adopt as Class B legislation the Senate Council's recommendation of an amendment to Section 4.2 of the University of Miami Patent and Copyright Policy as follows:

4.2 RIGHTS OF UNIVERSITY. Copyrightable material, which includes, but is not limited to, reproducible materials such as films, film strips, and video and audio recordings, resulting from a project assigned to a faculty member or staff member as a part of his regular duties shall inure to the University if, but only if, so specified at the time of assignment, by an instrument of specific detail and agreement signed by the said faculty or staff member, by his department chairman or director, and by his school or college dean. The agreement of the parties regarding re-use of such copyrightable material, including the amount of compensation, if any, to the faculty or staff member for such re-use, shall be expressed in said instrument. If there is no such agreement, the copyright shall belong to the faculty or staff member.

Motion carried unanimously.

#### #73014 Placement Testing Program

Motion was made and seconded to adopt as Class B legislation the recommendation of the Senate Council to change the Bulletin as follows:

Before their initial registration, all students entering or transferring with fewer than fifteen (15) credits must take placement tests.

Motion was made and seconded to refer this matter back to the Academic Planning Committee for further study. Motion carried unanimously.

## #73015 Student Voting Member on the Academic Planning Committee

Motion was made and seconded to adopt as Class B legislation the Senate Council's recommendation of an amendment to Bylaw 4.2 under section IV. Committees, of the Faculty Manual as follows:

The Committee shall be composed of the Dean of Faculties, ex officio, the Deans of three schools, one member elected from (at least at the time of election) and by the Council of each school not represented by its Dean, and one student member elected by the Executive Committee of the Student Body Government (President, Vice President, Treasurer) and ratified by the Student Senate. Each Dean shall serve for a three year period, and one being replaced each year in cyclic order determined alphabetically by school name.

The underlined sections indicate the changes. Motion carried unanimously.

The following information items were presented:

- 1. Sabbatical Leave Program--On 3/7/73 the President acknowledged receipt of the Ad Hoc Committee Report on the Sabbatical Leave Program and indicated that Dr. McKenry will pursue the matter.
- 2. #73004 Mid-Semester Deficiency Report--On 3/7/73 the President approved the Class B legislation on the above-mentioned item which the Senate passed on 2/26/73 providing the funds for its implementation can be allocated. The President will try to find the necessary funds.
- 3. #73005 Bylaw 3.11 under section III. Election and Voting Procedures--On 3/9/73 the President acknowledged the Class B legislation of an amendment to the above-mentioned item which the Senate passed on 2/26/73. He has approved the amendment and it became effective immediately.
- 4. #73006 Voting Representation on the Board of Trustees—On 3/12/73 the President acknowledged the Senate Class D action which requested faculty voting representation on the Board. He stated he will take the recommendation to the Executive Committee for its review.
- 5. #73007 Interpretive Bylaw to Section 2.2 of the Charter-The Senate approved this interpretive Bylaw as Class B legislation on 2/26/73. In his memo of 3/9/73 the President stated he is delaying approval until he has received and reviewed the Medical faculty determinations on titles and prefixes.

- 6. #73001 Early Retirement--On 4/2/73 the President stated he would refer the Joint Referral Committee's recommendation on early retirement to the Executive Committee of the Board for review.
- #73002 Consulting and Compensation for Non-University Activities--By memo of 4/6/73 the President approved the Senate's amendment to the Joint Referral Committee's recommendation on the above-mentioned subject. The legislation became effective immediately.
- #73008 Housing for Minority Group Employees--The President acknowledged receipt of the Senate's Class D action endorsing the resolution on housing previously adopted by the Board. will become a part of the University's official policies.
- #73009 Ad Hoc Committee Report Concerning the President's Draft Report on University Governance--The President, by memo dated 3/30/73, acknowledged receipt of the Senate's Class D action concerning the above-mentioned report. He reiterated that he has agreed to incorporate most of the recommendations of the Committee in his report to the Board on April 11.
- 10. #73010 Credit Only Option Amendment--The President on 4/4/73 approved the Senate's Class B action amending the credit only option policy. It will become effective in the fall semester, 1973.

#### Faculty Senate Liaison to the Student Senate

The Council reviewed a memo dated 2/14/73 with attached resolution of 2/12, from Kevin Poeppleman, Speaker, Student Senate, concerning a request that the Faculty Senate select a liaison from the Faculty Senate to the Student Senate. Mr. Poeppleman was asked to explain the proposed resolution. He stated that the provision of "full voting rights at meetings" be withdrawn from the proposal.

Following discussion, motion was made and seconded to accept the proposal as altered by Mr. Poeppleman. Motion carried and will be submitted to the Senate as a Class D action.

#### Student Representatives on the Faculty Senate

The Council discussed a memo dated 3/9/73 with accompanying resolution from Alan Richard, Senator, College of Arts and Sciences,

Student Senate, concerning a proposal for student representatives on the Faculty Senate.

Following discussion, motion was made and seconded to approve student representatives on the Faculty Senate. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made and seconded to amend the main motion to include the right to present motions to the Faculty Senate. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made to amend the amended motion by limiting the number of representatives to one. No second to the motion. Motion was withdrawn.

Motion was made and seconded to amend the amended motion so that the number of representatives be limited to three: two from the Undergraduate Student Body and one from the Graduate Student Association. Motion passed unanimously.

The Chairman authorized the Vice Chairman to put the resolution in legislative form for submittion to the Senate as Class B legislation.

### Faculty Committee on Professional Standards and Conduct

This item was withdrawn upon Dr. Harrison's request.

### Credit Union Mass Marketing Program -- Insurance

The Chairman read a memo dated 3/15/73 from Dr. W. F. Landsea and Mr. C. F. Eyre relative to the Credit Union insurance program.

Following discussion, motion was made and seconded to reaffirm the action of the Council on 7/28/72. Motion failed.

The Chairman is to write Professors Landsea and Eyre to inform them of the Council's action. Dr. Beckham thought the Chairman might mention to them that he believes this is a matter which should be taken up with the Vice President for Academic Affairs.

## Ad Hoc Committee Report on Interdisciplinary Activities

The Council reviewed a report dated 3/14/73 from the

above-mentioned committee. Motion was made to delete that portion of the sentence beginning with the word "all" in line two of item 2. STUDENTS, and ending with the word "program" in lines 4-5 and insert in its place "both the umbrella program and the students major department".

Motion was made and seconded to delete that portion of the sentence beginning with the word "fund" in line two of item 3. FACULTY, and ending with the word "assistance" in line five and insert in its place "appropriate financial considerations.".

Motion was made and seconded to accept as Class B legislation items 1-3 of the report as amended. Motion carried unanimously.

In regard to item 4. <u>CENTERS</u>, since there is an ad hoc committee studying a recommendation on centers at the University, the Chairman is to report back to the Council its findings at the next meeting.

#### #70013 Patent and Copyright Policy Revision

The Council reviewed a memo dated 2/27/73 with attachement from the University Patent and Copyright Committee relative to their proposed modification of Section 4.2 of the University Patent and Copyright Policy.

Motion was approved with one abstention to accept the committee's recommended revisions as Class B legislation and submit it to the Senate for adoption.

#### Department Chairmen Evaluation

The Chairman felt that Section 11.3 under IX. Appointment and Retention of Administrative Officers of the Faculty Charter concerning the evaluation of department chairmen needed clarification in several respects.

The following motion was passed unanimously as an interpretation of Section 11.3:

That the Chairman of the Senate be authorized to act on behalf of the Senate Council to keep informed of the vote of department chairmen and to request a written explanation when there is an inconsistency with the vote of the faculty and the decision of the appointing authority.

#### Academic Planning and Curriculum Committees

This item was deferred until the next meeting.

#### Transfer Students and Placement Tests

The Council reviewed a memo dated 4/6/73 from the Academic Planning Committee concerning a proposed change in the statement on page 93 of the University Bulletin relative to undergraduate studies. Dr. Besvinick was present and gave the basis for the recommended change.

Following discussion, motion was made and seconded to approve the Academic Planning Committee recommendation as Class B legislation and to submit it to the Senate for adoption. Motion carried unanimously.

#### Financial Exigency

Memo from Dr. McKenry dated 4/9/73 concerning a matter of financial exigency was handed out at the meeting. McKenry stated that the President, through his authorized agent, the Vice President for Academic Affairs, has this date, under the procedures on page 18 of the Faculty Manual, taken the position that the Administration is willing to concede tenure; that the Administration declares a financial exigency and that if the Senate Council does not accept this declaration of financial exigency then the Administration withdraws its concession of tenure.

Dr. Sofen believed that this matter should be sent to the Rank, Salary and Conditions of Employment Committee for its consideration. After receiving the committee's recommendation, the Senate Council would then review the matter.

The Council agreed that the faculty member in question be requested to come before the Senate Council at its next meeting.

#### Faculty Contracts 73-74

Samples of the different contract forms for the various faculty appointments were circulated as an information item. A proposed statement dated 4/2/73 clarifying the new contract forms was discussed and will accompany the contracts to the faculty.

#### Student Voting Member on the Academic Planning Committee

A memo from the Academic Planning Committee dated 4/6/73 concerning a proposed student voting member on the Academic Planning Committee was distributed and discussed. Motion was made and seconded to accept the Committee's recommendation to amend Bylaw 4.2 under Section IV. Committees of the Faculty Manual. Motion carried

Motion was made to amend the main motion by deleting in line 13 the word "A" and inserting "The". Motion carried.

It was requested that the Student Relations Committee be asked to study the feasibility of student voting membership on other Senate committees.

Dr. Harrison invited the Senate Council to hold its last meeting on April 30 at the Faculty Club at 2:30 p.m.

A special meeting of the Senate Council will be held on Tuesday, April 24 at 4:00 p.m. to discuss the case of financial exigency.

#### Meetings of the Faculty Senate

The Chairman asked the Council's sentiment with regard to Bylaw 2.2 under Section II. Meetings of the Faculty Manual which states that the regular meetings of the Senate shall be open to members of the University faculty but not to the press or to students. The Council reaffirmed Bylaw 2,2, specifically that the press is barred from attending Senate meetings.

This item was deferred until the next meeting.

This item was deferred until the next meeting.

# Ad Hoc Committee on Interdisciplinary Activities Report RECOMMENDATIONS ON INTERDISCIPLINARY ACTIVITIES

- 1. RESEARCH: In the case of interdisciplinary research involving faculty and/or research scientists from different units (Departments, Schools, Colleges, Centers) of the university, the research projects and separate budgets of each faculty or research scientist should be reported in his/her unit and the unit should receive due credit. If the budgets are unseparated, then the total budget should be reported in the unit of each researcher with a note indicating the interdisciplinary nature of the project and the university units involved. (Records affected: Research Coordination, Institutional Research, Budget, Research Accounting, Units)
- 2. STUDENTS: Students enrolled in an interdisciplinary program should be listed in and due credit given to all che university units involved in the interdisciplinary program.by multiple-listing even if an administrative unit exists for the administration of the program. (Records affected: Institutional Research, Registrar, Graduate School, Units.)
- 3. FACULTY: Team teaching, teaching in another unit or program should be recognized by fund transfers, between the units affected, which appropriately reflect the duties and costs and which may enable the unit to obtain substitute teaching assistance. (Records

affected: Institional Research, Budget, Units.)

- 4. CENTERS:1) It is recognized that the centers play an important role in academic activities such as interdisciplinary research and interdisciplinary programs. Consequently, the centers should be represented in the university organs concerned with the academic activities such as the Academic Planning Committee, the Graduate Council, the curriculum committees and the Faculty Senate. This could be achieved by electing members to the above stated university bodies through a "Council of Centers" which could be formed by members (1 or 2) elected by the centers.
  - 2) The centers should inform the university faculty of their activities (research, teaching, other), budget, staff, etc. by means of annual reports.

## 2. Letter addressed to Dr. Faber from Dr. Franklin

Dr. Phyllis Franklin attended this portion of the Council meeting to interpret her letter of October 17, 1975, addressed to Dr. Faber. Dr. Franklin strongly objects to external letters asking for recommendation of a faculty member in matters of tenure being misinterpreted in closed faculty files. - 3. Terms of present members will be adjusted as follows:

A motion to accept these three recommendations was made by Dr. Yacoub, seconded by Dr. Faber and passed.

A fourth recommendation is as follows:

4. The School of Continuing Studies shall have a regular membership on the Academic Appeals Committee.

A motion to accept Item 4 was made by Dr. Faber, seconded by Dr. Tershakovec. It did not pass.

The Committee on Committees read a request from Dr. M. Eugene Flipse, Director, Health Service suggesting that a faculty member from the medical school be added to the Fringe Benefits Committee.

Dr. Yacoub made a motion, seconded by Dr. Emiliani that Dr. George Tershakovec be invited to become a member. The motion was passed.

The ad hoc Committee to Study Joint Appointments (Recommendation IX of the TRB Report) had one person decline to become a member. The Committee on Committees therefore recommended one person from the Tenure Review Board Committee.

The motion was made by Dr. Yacoub, seconded by Dr. Emiliani to ask Mr. Blake King to become a member of this ad hoc committee. The motion was passed.

Dr. Emiliani questioned his own position as Senator from RSMAS since his primary appointment is Geology and RSMAS his secondary appointment. It was decided to ask the Ad Hoc Committee on Joint Appointments to study Dr. Emiliani's being a senator from his secondary school.

#### 6. Statement on Salaries

At the Faculty Senate meeting, Monday October 27, 1975, the Senate Council was given the responsibility of preparing a statement on salaries to be presented at the next Senate meeting.

Today, Dr. Yacoub presented a Proposed Statement as prepared by the Faculty Senate Budget Committee.

Dr. Emiliani made a motion, seconded by Dr. Massey that an amendment to the statement be to strike - <a href="Item 1">Item 1</a>. The amendment was passed. Thereafter a vote was taken on the amended statement and it was passed.

Dr. Yacoub requested the next meeting of the Senate take place Monday November 17, 1975 instead of November 24, so that the final statement as passed by the Faculty Senate would be delivered to the Budget and Finance Committee of the Board of Trustees before their next meeting November 25, 1975. If space for this meeting on November 17th is available, an Agenda will be sent to all Senators and Departments and all faculty will be invited to attend. A motion was passed to this effect.

#### Information Items

 Dr. Salzman read a letter from Dr. Catz asking for clarification on the matter of voting rights of Visiting and Research faculty members, in particular, rights to vote in departmental and other faculty matters.

It was decided to appoint a three person ad hoc committee to make recommendations on rights and privileges for these persons. Dr. Duke agreed to become a member, Ms. Nancy Noble will be invited and Dr. Emiliani said he will call in the name of a faculty member from RSMAS to be on this committee since this question involves many of the people from that School.

2. A committee representing the School of Education wrote a letter to the Council expressing concern for faculty members who take over teaching responsibilities for members of their faculty who are ill from 30 days to 6 months, the time necessary before long term disability insurance become effective. This question will be sent to the Fringe Benefits Committee to consider a sick leave policy for faculty members.

#### Information Items

3. A modification to the Faculty Charter, as proposed by the ad hoc Committee for Study of the Ph.D. at the University of Miami, was read by Dr. Salzman.

The Faculty Manual, page 30, reads:

"Faculty members of the rank of assistant professor and above may not apply for study for the doctor's degree at the University of Miami."

Suggested change:

"Ordinarily faculty members of the rank of assistant professor and above may not apply for study for the doctor's degree at the University of Miami. In unusually meritorious cases exceptions to this rule may be granted by the Dean of the Graduate School, but in no case will an applicant be allowed to study for a doctoral degree in his own department."

A motion to accept the modification was made by Dr. Emiliani and seconded by Dr. Faber. The motion was passed.

4. A letter from Dr. Wood concerning parking problems day and night in the areas of the Ashe Building and Library was read to the Council. Dr. Besvinick said two more meter maids have been hired bringing the total to 4. He will also personally check into night-time parking irregularities in the lots outside these two buildings. Dr. Wood's letter will be forwarded to the Parking Authority Committee.

#### Executive Session

A Report was distributed as a follow-up of the Senate Action passed at the April 21, 1975 meeting, in which the

Senate passed a Resolution relating to Dr. Stanford. A motion to accept the Report was made and seconded. In discussion it was felt that it was not an appropriate time to submit this Report to the Senate and that it was premature. A motion to table was seconded and passed.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:15 p.m.
