¹ C18.2.2 Other NAMED or TITLED ACADEMIC UNITS established under Bylaw 6.6 may be approved by the Faculty Senate and the President. For each such approved unit, the Executive Vice-President and Provost shall consult with the dean of the host school at five year intervals to determine whether the unit remains active and shall report to the Faculty Senate the names of those that should be disestablished.

C18.2.3 Periodic five year reviews may be conducted on all programs, centers, institutes and similar academic units as deemed appropriate by the Faculty Senate or the Executive Vice-President and Provost.

I write to request the Medical School Council support changing the name of the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine Miami Institute of Human Genomics (MIHG) to the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine John P. Hussman Institute for Human Genomics, which may be abbreviated University of Miami Miller School of Medicine Hussman Institute for Human Genomics (HIHG).

This name change is a result of an extremely generous \$20 million gift from the John P. Hussman Foundation to the University. The monies will be used to support the core mission of the Institute--research into the causes, prevention and treatment of common but complex diseases, including cancers, cardiovascular disease, autism, Parkinson's and Alzheimer's.
