Doctor of Musical Arts in Vocal Pedagogy and Performance

Rationale for Name Change

The Doctor of Musical Arts in Vocal Pedagogy and Performance is designed to prepare singers for careers as professional teachers of singing, performers, and research scholars in the field of Vocal Pedagogy. It seeks to encourage critical thinking and creative teaching built on the current science and research in the field of vocal pedagogy and performance artistry.

The degree program is built around a core of vocal pedagogy with supportive courses in applied voice, music education, performance ensembles, and internships designed to integrate course work with individual interests. The program emphasizes the integration of a broad array of performing, teaching and research skills.

Candidates for admission to the DMA in Vocal Pedagogy and Performance are expected to have a completed master's degree, teaching experience and evidence of a strong performance-academic background. A personal statement of philosophy of teaching is required with the application. It is expected that the following course work will have been completed prior to acceptance into the program: 1) basic vocal pedagogy, 2) lyric diction (IPA, English, French, Italian and German) 3) opera literature, 4) art song literature, 5) language study with at least one year each in Italian, French and German, 6) keyboard skills. If any of these area of study has not been completed, remedial work must be completed before the qualifying exams are taken.

DMA in Vocal Pedagogy and Performance candidates will be expected to complete research projects within their own area of interest. In addition to performing one solo recital, students will design and present a public lecture focusing on a particular area of interest. Finally, the candidate will write a doctoral essay that demonstrates competence in the discipline, scholarly method and analysis, original thought, and the ability to sustain ideas and express them with clarity.

A definite need exists for DMA programs to prepare advanced singers for careers in teaching. Historically, doctoral degrees in vocal performance are pursued for the purpose of teaching at the college level. Ironically, most doctoral degrees in vocal performance include little or no work in the pedagogy of the instrument, much less work in curriculum design, course organization or administrative skills. These are exactly the skill areas that are demanded in today's job market.

In the United States of America, only a few institutions offer a Doctorate of Musical Arts Performance/Pedagogy degree. Most programs have a heavy core of performance requirements with a secondary emphasis in pedagogy. One program focuses more strongly on pedagogy, but does not include a significant performance component as part of the degree work. Several universities offer general degrees in pedagogy, but this usually means that one or two pedagogy courses are included in the course of study. In the state of Florida, indeed, the Southeastern United States, no institution offers a doctoral degree in vocal pedagogy and performance.

In the summer of 2000 the Department of Vocal Performance designed and offered a one-week seminar in Vocal Pedagogy for the 21st Century. The response was very

encouraging, with thirty-one participants from across the United States and the Caribbean enrolled, and inquiries came from all over the world. In January 2000, the University of Miami hosted a NATS Winter Workshop dealing with the "Belt" voice technique for musical theatre and commercial singers. Fifty participants were expected; one hundred and twenty enrolled. The follow-up workshop in New York City, in 2001, enrolled 700 teachers and singers, the most ever for a NATS Workshop! The need for an advanced degree in vocal pedagogy is obvious. The University of Miami School of Music is able to offer an outstanding, well-rounded program in vocal pedagogy that can produce graduates with a professional advantage to becoming leading scholars in the field.

The current faculty of the department of vocal performance consists of artist-teachers who offer individual areas of expertise to the course of study for doctoral candidates in vocal pedagogy, and committed to the preparation of future teachers of singing. The University of Miami has established nationally recognized music theatre and jazz vocal programs with experienced artist teachers who can offer insight into those areas of vocal training.

The University of Miami has an outstanding Department of Otolaryngology in the School of Medicine. A relationship is already established between the Department of Vocal Performance and the Department of Otolaryngology. This relationship has the potential for the team teaching of courses, specially designed seminars, and internships in the department of otolaryngology.

A strong doctoral program in vocal pedagogy would enhance the undergraduate program at the University of Miami. Candidates would be assigned to teach applied and class voice, thereby helping to address the recent large demand for voice lessons. When appropriate, the candidates would participate and offer their experience to the Opera Theater and Choral Studies programs. The shared scholarly research of the candidates would stimulate the faculty and enhance the vocal training of the undergraduate students at the University.
