Dear Prof. Williamson:

Please find the enclosed copy of an updated post-master's certificate program that the University of Miami School of Nursing and Health Studies would like to start this Summer semester, 2012. The faculty has traditionally offered an MSN in Psychiatric Mental-Health Nursing in the past as both a direct MSN offering and as a post-master's certificate offering for those students who already held an MSN degree from our program or from a school or university with a similar MSN program.

The only difference between this currently proposed post-master's program and that of the past is that this program is being delivered as a hybrid program. The program is by no means an entirely online program. All of the content courses will be offered through the use of Collaborate which is a synchronous delivery of content with students being able to see and hear the instructor and students use of the internet to communicate with the instructor and other students. Written communications are visible to all. In addition, up to six students with cameras will be able to both see and hear each other and the course instructor.

Also, the clinical practicum component of all the courses is undertaken with direct supervision of a faculty member and a possible preceptor. The clinical components are undertaken either at the School of Nursing Simulation Laboratory or University of Miami Hospital.

I would appreciate the opportunity to present this program to the Graduate Council at your earliest convenience in an attempt to make this offering available this Summer, 2012.

Psychiatric Mental Health Nursing of Family Post-Master's Certificate Program

This post-master's certificate is available for MSN graduates who would like to gain further knowledge in advanced practice psychiatric mental health nursing of family. The program can be completed in one year of full-time study.

This post-master's certificate program has a focus on advanced practice psychiatric-mental health nursing as a specialty area. A multi-theoretical model is used to examine issues relevant to mental health and illness throughout the life span. The program prepares students to provide comprehensive and integrative psychiatric mental health care to those in need of psychiatric services, as well as those who are at risk. The program has 18 graduate level academic credits of mental health theory and supervised clinical experiences in three psychotherapeutic treatment modalities (individual, group and family) and encompasses treatment across the life span, from childhood through senescence.

The program is available to any nurse holding an MSN degree and is particularly relevant to:

• Adult Nurse Practitioners or Family Nurse Practitioners who wish to prepare for a second certification in Psychiatric Mental Health Nursing.

Career Opportunities

Advanced practice psychiatric mental health nurses have multiple and diverse career opportunities including providing care in large health care organizations and in the community. Graduates of the program are prepared to function independently and collaboratively with health care team members to provide comprehensive health care that will maximize patient care outcomes.

Certification and Accreditation

Completion of the program provides eligibility for certification as a family psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner by the American Nurses' Association American Nurses Credentialing Center starting in 2015*, and for state licensure/certification where available.

Admission Requirements

In addition to the requirements for admission to the graduate program of the University of Miami School of Nursing and Health Studies, the applicant must meet the following requirements:
