Subject: Faculty Senate Legislation #2016-15(B) – Modification to Current Graduate School

Policies for the School of Business Administration

The Faculty Senate, at its September 28, 2016 meeting voted by majority with five votes against and two abstentions to approve the proposal to modify the current Graduate School policies for the School of Business Administration. The modification will allow graduate students in the School of Business Administration whose GPA falls below 3.0 to continue in the program under a probationary status. Students wishing to repeat a course may petition their program advisor to do so within one semester after their GPA falls below 3.0. If the petition is granted by the program advisor, the grade obtained in their second attempt will replace the original grade for purposes of calculating their GPA for clearance for graduation only.

A course may be repeated only once and students may not repeat more than two courses. The student's transcript will continue to show all attempts and the GPA computation for purposes other than computing the GPA for clearance for graduation will include all grades earned.

RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED MODIFICATION

Current Graduate School Policies

- 1. Graduate Students must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 for award of degree.
- 2. Repeat of classes and GPA calculation:

A student may repeat a course in which a failing grade was earned, but the repetition of the course will not eliminate the previous grade from the record. A course may be repeated only once unless written authorization is provided by the Dean of the Graduate School. All grades are included in the computation of the quality point average. If a course in which an unsatisfactory grade (as determined by the program advisor) was earned is repeated and the repeat grade is a "C-" or higher, the number of credits required for graduation will be increased by the number of credits repeated. Registrations which involve repeating a course in which a grade of "A" or "B" has already been earned may not earn quality points or credit hours, nor count as credits attempted.

Issue with the Current Policy:

Some full-time graduate business students have a hard time adjusting in the first semester after years away from school. Also, due to medical issues in a particular semester, some students are not able to do as well as their potential and receive low grades. Because of few low grades (e.g., C) in the first semester or the semester that that they have medical issues in, their GPA falls below 3.0 for the entire program. To get their GPA above 3.0, they have to take courses outside their program requirements. It is desirable to have some flexibility to permit such students to repeat a limited number of classes, instead. In addition to serving the student and program learning objectives better, having such flexibility will also reduce the pressure on faculty to award potentially undeserving higher grades to students.

Proposed Modification to the Graduate School policy on the calculation of the GPA

Graduate students in the School of Business Administration who fall below the 3.0 GPA may be allowed to continue in the program under a probationary status. Students wishing to repeat a course may petition their program advisor to do so. If their petition is granted, the grade obtained in their second attempt will replace the original grade for purposes of calculating their GPA for clearance for graduation. Authorization to repeat a course is limited to courses in which the earned grade is lower than a B. Additionally, a course may be repeated only once and students may not repeat more than 2 courses. The student's transcript will continue to show all attempts and the GPA computation will include all grades earned for purposes other than computing the GPA for clearance for graduation.





Modification to Current Graduate School Policies

The School of Business Administration submitted a proposal to modify a Graduate School policy on the calculation of the GPA. The proposal was discussed at the meeting of the Graduate Council on Monday, April 18, 2016, and the following was unanimously approved by those present.

Graduate students in the School of Business Administration who fall below the 3.0 GPA may be placed on academic probation. Within one semester after their GPA falling below 3.0, Master's students wishing to repeat a course may petition their program director to do so. If the petition is approved by the graduate program director, the grade obtained in their second attempt will replace the original grade for purposes of calculating their GPA for clearance for graduation only. Authorization to repeat a course is limited to courses in which an unsatisfactory grade was earned (as determine by the graduate program director). Additionally, a course may be repeated only once and students may not repeat more than two courses. The student's transcript will continue to show all attempts and the GPA computation will include all grades earned for purposes other than computing the GPA for clearance for graduation. If a course in which an unsatisfactory grade of lower than a B- was earned is repeated and the repeat grade is "C-" or higher, the number of credits required for graduation will be increased by the number of credits repeated. Registrations which involve repeating a course in which a grade of "A" or "B" has already been earned may not earn quality points or credit hours, nor count as credits attempted.
