Curriculum Change to Master of Music in Keyboard Performance

On November 1, 2016, the Frost School of Music notified our office of its intent to change the existing curriculum of the Master of Music in Keyboard Performance (MM MKPF) program, effective fall 2017. The proposed curriculum will place greater emphasis on performance and career preparation, while allowing for flexibility to pursue course work in preparation for DMA work. The proposed curriculum will not alter the current 30-credit requirement.

The itemization of the proposed changes is as follows:

- Remove MED 701 Recital Paper Preparation and MKP 811 Master's Recital Paper
- Replace MTC 717 Analytical Techniques with the wording "MTC elective(s)" and add in pool of music electives.
- Replace MCY 726-727 Keyboard Literature I-II with wording "MCY 726-727 Keyboard Literature I-II
 or MCY elective" and add in a pool of music electives.
- Decrease 4 credits of approved music electives to 3-credits using listing of suggested courses.
- Add zero-credit Oral Comprehensive Exam to requirements in order to meet NASM and SACSCOC requirements for comprehensive review (exam to be scheduled for date after the recital).

The proposed changes will not require the hiring of additional faculty or infrastructure resources and would make the MM MKPF program requirements fall closer in line with NASM guidelines.

Based on the details of the proposal, the curriculum change is not considered substantive and will not require notification or approval by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) in order to proceed with its implementation.

The proposal was discussed at the meeting of the Graduate Council on Tuesday, November 15, 2016, and no concerns were expressed by the Council members.

Department of Keyboard Performance (MKP) Master of Music Degree in Keyboard Performance Proposal to Change Curriculum

1. Description of the Proposed Curriculum Change

Degree Program:

The Master of Music in Keyboard Performance

Effective Date:

Fall of 2017

Benefit:

The proposed MM in MKP curriculum will place a greater emphasis on performance and career preparation, while allowing for flexibility to pursue course work in preparation

for a DMA work.

Effects on Credits:

The proposed curriculum will not alter the required credits of 30. Not increasing the credits required will aid enrollment for self-pay or partial-pay students. Also, with the combined 5year BM-MM curriculum under consideration, decrease in

credits is helpful.

Effect on Electives: The proposed curriculum will decrease music electives from 4

credits to 3 credits.

Non-Music Electives: The proposed curriculum will not increase non-music

electives.

Other Degrees:

The proposed revision is not expected to have any impact on

other degree programs in the Frost School of Music.

Above meets the NASM requirement: Major area is at least 1/3 of the total credits for the degree, and Supportive Studies are up to ½ of the degree.

Revisions to the MM in MKP

- 1. Remove MED 701 Recital Paper Preparation
- 2. Remove MKP 811 Master's Recital Paper
- 3. Previous courses under "other studies in music" (MTC, MCY, Pedagogy elective) were consolidated into a larger pool of advisor-approved and Artist Development courses. Five, 3-credit courses are required. Students would be strongly advised to take at least one 3-credit course from each of the four categories, leaving the flexibility open to take two courses from the same category.
 - a. Replace MTC 717 Analytical Techniques with the wording, "MTC elective(s)" and put in a pool of music electives.
 - b. Replace MCY 626-627 Keyboard Literature I-II with the wording, "MCY 626-627 Keyboard Literature I-II or MCY elective" and put in a pool of music electives.
- 4. 4 credits of approved music electives is decreased, at least on paper,* to 3 credits, with suggested courses listed. (* "4 credits" is what is listed currently, but it has been 3 credits in practice since Keyboard Pedagogy course change entailed a credit change from 2 to 3, making the elective credits to be 3 in practice.)
- 5. To meet NASM and SACS requirement for a comprehensive review, added a zero-credit Oral Comprehensive Exam to the requirements. The exam is to be scheduled for a date after the recital.

Oral Comprehensive Exam

Oral Comprehensive Exam is to be scheduled after the Master's Recital. The exam shall be approximately 20 minutes in length before a committee consisting of 3 members of the full-time, regular MKP department faculty including the principal teacher/advisor. During the exam, the committee will ask questions to test the depth and breadth of student's knowledge and understanding relevant to professional-level preparation and performance of works presented in the Master's Recital. This may include questions NOT directly related to the program of the Master's Recital, thus encompassing relevant aspects from the historical, stylistic, pedagogical, and performance points of view.

Estimated Impact on Faculty Load:

We do not anticipate any increase in faculty load.

Impact on Room Schedule and Lab/Classroom Needs:

There will be no impact on room schedule.

Impact on NASM and SACS Requirements:

The proposed curriculum meets and exceeds NASM requirements. The requirement of comprehensive review is satisfied by an oral defense subsequent to a recital.

Impact on NASM and SACS Requirements:

The proposed curriculum meets and exceeds NASM requirements. The requirement of comprehensive review is satisfied by an oral defense subsequent to a recital.

The New Curriculum:

Will be offered to current students with the supervision of the advisor and the graduate dean. Until the fall of 2017, MKP faculty will continue advising and grading students who are working on the MM Recital Paper included in the current curriculum.

Suggested Four-Semester Sequence of Study

Total credits: 30 credits

Final semester: MKP 812 will satisfy the full-time status. Tuition waiver will cover only credits required for the degree.

Course Description: The second recital in the masters degree as an elective option as approved by an advisor. The program should consist of memorized solo piano repertoire, with an optional inclusion of representative chamber or concerto repertoire instead of, or in combination with, the solo repertoire.

Course Objectives:

- Students will demonstrate in-depth knowledge and understanding of repertoire by performing a 60-minute recital.
- Students will demonstrate advanced performance skills supported by technique and musicianship that communicate musical intent and aesthetic quality.
- Students will demonstrate professional preparation of repertoire, including memorization of standard solo repertoire and effective collaboration with peer musicians (if chamber or concerto repertoire is included).

Assignments:

The following assignments are mandatory, and additional requirements may be added depending on students' needs:

- Regular attendance at weekly meetings with faculty advisor
- Selection of appropriate repertoire from various time periods or under a meaningful, overarching theme
- Selection of appropriate recital committee members
- Request for Recital Date through Concert Hall office
- Successful completion of dress rehearsal
- Successful completion and recording of full-length recital

Grading:

This course is graded on an S/U Basis, as follows:

- Grade of "S" reflects satisfactory work. The grade does not impact the student's GPA, but indicates that the course credit may count toward degree requirements.
- Grade of "U" reflects unsatisfactory work. The grade does not impact the student's GPA, but indicates that the course credit may not count toward degree requirements.
