Subject: Faculty Senate Legislation #2018-43(B) - Frost School of Music, Revision of the Master

of Music Degree in Music Therapy with Undergraduate Equivalency

The Faculty Senate, at its February 27, 2019 meeting, had no objections to the proposal from the Frost School of Music to revise the Master of Music degree in Music Therapy with Undergraduate Equivalency. The length of the program will be increased due to an increase in the credit hours of two required courses within the program as noted on the proposal. The credit hours for these courses are increasing to more accurately reflect the in-class and out-of-class time required for each course per the University's credit hour policy. The change only involves the Undergraduate Equivalency component of the program by increasing the length of that component from 44 to 46 credit hours. This will increase the overall program length from 81 credit hours to 83 credit hours. The graduate component of the program will remain the same at 37 credit hours.

This legislation is now forwarded to you for your action.

Increase in Program Length of the MM in Music Therapy with Undergraduate

Equivalency

On November 20, 2018, the Frost School of Music notified my office of its intent to increase the program length of the Master of Music (MM) in Music Therapy with Undergraduate Equivalency program (Academic Plan Code: MTYPE_MM) effective Fall 2019 for new students. Currently enrolled students will not be affected by this change.

The proposed increase in program length is due to an increase in the credit hours of two required courses within the program: MED 159 Introduction to Music therapy (increasing from 2 to 3 credit hours) and MED 359 (increasing from 1 to 2 credit hours). The credit hours for these courses are increasing to more accurately reflect the in-class and out-of-class time required each course per the University's credit hour policy.

The proposed change only involves the Undergraduate Equivalency component of the program, increasing the length of that component from 44 to 46 credit hours which will increase the overall program length from 81 credit hours to 83 credit hours. The graduate component of the program will remain the same, 37 credit hours. No other changes are being made to the program.

The proposed change does not "represent a significant departure, either in content or method of delivery" from what we are currently approved by SACSCOC to offer due to the following:

- The proposed change meets the SACSCOC requirement of a minimum of 30 credit hours for a graduate program.
- The proposed change does not involve the creation of new courses or the hiring of new faculty.
- The majority of the program will not be offered via distance education and, in any case, the University is approved to offer 100% distance education programs.
- The program will be offered on the University's Coral Gables campus.
- The graduate program covers the literature in the field through its required coursework.
- The graduate program ensures ongoing student engagement in research and/or appropriate professional practice and training experiences through graduate practicums, a required internship and a final master's thesis or project.

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SACSCOC only requires notification of program changes that represent a significant departure from our current programs. Therefore, no notification or approval is required for this change.

Master of Music in Music Therapy with Undergraduate Equivalency Proposal to Change Curriculum October 2018

(1) Written description of proposed change and rationale

Name of degree program: Master of Music in Music Therapy with Undergraduate Equivalency

The Master of Music degree in Music Therapy with Undergraduate Equivalency is designed for individuals who have already completed a bachelor's degree in some area of music (i.e., music performance, music education, etc.) and who seek graduate level training as a music therapist. Ultimately, this degree program prepares students for either advanced-level clinical practice, or additional opportunities in research or college teaching.

Students first complete one year of undergraduate prerequisite courses in music, music therapy, psychology, and biology. These courses provide the student with entry-level clinical competency. In years two and three, students complete graduate level coursework as required for the Master of Music degree in Music Therapy.

Proposed Changes (Effective date: 2019-2020 academic year)

The MTY faculty propose the following credit hour increases to the undergraduate equivalency requirements in the M.M. in Music Therapy with Undergraduate Equivalency degree program. The primary purpose of these increases is to more accurately reflect student and instructor workload in each course and adhere to the federal definition of a credit hour (http://bulletin.miami.edu/general-university-information/university-policies/, under "Course Information."

- (1) Raise credit hours of MED 159 Introduction to Music Therapy from 2 credits to 3 credits

 Rationale: (a) This increase more accurately reflects current student workload and course content (more specifically, amount of information covered and course assignments). (b) MED 159 is being developed into an online course. Online courses are required to be 3 credits; thus, this increase aligns with those requirements and allowed MED 159 to be an online course.
- (2) Raise credit hour of MED 359 Music Therapy Practicum 1A from 1 credit to 2 credits

 Rationale: This increase more accurately reflects current student workload and course content.

 Music therapy students already complete 2 hours of instructional time (1 hour classroom and 1 hour practicum) and approximately 4 hours of course preparation a week. Increasing the number of credits from 1 to 2 credits adequately values the course and is a more accurate representation of the work for the transcript. Furthermore, this increase brings MED 359 in alignment with the number of credit hours in the other practicum courses required of students in this degree program at the graduate level (MED 757-759).

Impact of Proposed Changes on Credits

The proposal increases the number of undergraduate equivalency credits for the Masters of Music in Music Therapy with Undergraduate Equivalency from 44 to 46 credits. The number of credits for the degree overall will increase from 81 to 83 credits.

There is no change to the number of music electives, non-music electives, or general education requirements of the degree. This proposal does not impact any other degree program.

The MTY faculty propose the following credit hour increases to undergraduate equivalency requirements in the M.M. in Music Therapy with Undergraduate Equivalency degree program:

- 1. Raise credit hours of MED 159 Introduction to Music Therapy from 2 credits to 3 credits
- 2. Raise credit hour of MED 359 Music Therapy Practicum 1A from 1 credit to 2 credits

(6) Impact of Proposed Changes on Faculty Load

- Proposed Change 1: Raising the credit hours for MED 159 Introduction to Music Therapy would have a minor impact on faculty load as it would require MTY faculty or TAs to meet with students for 150 minutes a week instead of the current 100 minutes a week. The impact on course preparation, grading, and other components would be negligible as the credit increase would reflect current workload and course content.
- Proposed Change 2: Raising the credit hours of MED 359 Music Therapy Practicum 1A would not impact overall faculty load.

(7) Impact of Proposed Changes on Room Schedule and Lab/Classroom Needs

- Proposed Change 1: Raising the credit hours for MED 159 Introduction to Music Therapy would impact room scheduling as MED 159, which is currently scheduled for two 50-minute blocks on M/W, so it would need to switch to two 75-minute blocks on T/TH.
- Proposed Change 2: Raising the credit hours for MED 359 Music Therapy Practicum 1A would not impact room scheduling.

(8) Impact of Proposed Changes on NASM Requirements

The proposed changes do not impact current NASM requirements for the degree.

(9) Implementation Plan

The proposed curriculum will be required of students matriculating to the degree program in fall 2019. Given the changes only impact the first year of the degree, it will not be offered to current students in the degree.

Students complete three years of courses, followed by the internship, a 6-month, full-time clinical training experience that is completed off-campus at an approved facility. The bulk of the thesis work should be completed prior to internship. The thesis defense may take place before or after the internship.



October 22, 2018

The MTY program is proposing some curriculum changes to their BM degree:

- 1. increasing the number of credit hours for MED 159 (Introduction to Music Therapy) from 2 credits to 3 credits,
- 2. increasing the number of credit hours for their five practicum courses from 1 credit to 2 credits.
- 3. As part of the proposal they are also removing some requirements to balance these changes, resulting in a net increase of 1 credit to the BM degree.

In addition, because students in the masters/equivalency (MTYE) degree program take two of these courses (MED 159 and one of the practicum courses), they need to propose changes to this degree program as well.

- Raise the credit hours of MED 159 Introduction to Music Therapy from 2 credits to 3 credits
- 2. Raise the credit hours of MED 359 Music Therapy Practicum 1A from 1 credit to 2 credits

The MED department voted on October 17, 2018 to approve these changes.
