The Faculty Senate, at its March 27, 2019 meeting, had no objections to the proposal from the Business School to rename and revise the Health Sector Management and Policy major and minor in the Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) degree programs.

The name will be changed from "Health Sector Management and Policy" to "Health Management and Policy" to align with the recent name change of the department.

The current major requires successful completion of 24-credit hours, including 21-credit hours of required coursework and three credit hours of approved electives. The proposed revisions would decrease the program length to 21-credit hours by eliminating one required course,, ACC 31 Accounting for Health Care Organization. Additionally, the courses from which students choose the three-credit hours in elective have been changed to concentrate more on program-specific course developed since the current curriculum was proposed. The current and proposed curriculum for the major is the same for the BBA and BSBA programs.

The Faculty Senate does not approve budget concepts, therefore no budget information is included here.

This legislation is now forwarded to you for your action.

- i. Update curriculum of the Major in Health Management and Policy:
  - a. Remove ACC 315 from major (both B.B.A and B.S.B.A.)

Rationale: Accounting for Health Care Organizations. Approved by Chair of Department of Accounting. Majors in HMP will already have taken ACC 221 or ACC 211, ACC 222 or ACC 212. Removing ACC 315 removes duplicate material already covered in those core required courses.

- b. Remove the following electives from the major (both B.B.A and B.S.B.A) and the minor:
  - i. BPH 206 Introduction to Public Health
  - ii. BPH 305 Issues in Health Disparities
  - iii. BPH 309 Health and Environment
  - iv. BPH 310 Global Health
  - v. BPH 322 Introduction to Health Policy
  - vi. INS 570 Globalization and Health
  - vii. INS 571 International Development and Human Welfare
  - viii. INS 572 Global Health Policy and Ethics
  - ix. INS 573 Disasters, Terrorism and Global Public Health

Rationale: In the past, these courses were used as electives when the department did not have sufficient offerings. As the faculty and offerings have grown, students taking the HMP major and minor should focus on core courses taught by HMP instructors.

On February 11, 2019, the Miami Business School notified my office of its intent to rename and revise the requirements for the Health Sector Management and Policy major in the Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) (Academic Plan Code: HSMP\_BBA) and Bachelor of Science in Business Administration (BSBA) (Academic Plan Code: HSMP\_BSBA) degree programs as well as the undergraduate minor (Academic Plan Code: HSMP\_MN), effective Fall 2019. The name of the major/minor will change from "Health Sector Management and Policy" to "Health Management and Policy" to align with the recent change in the name of the department. The proposal also includes curricular changes as described below.

The current major requires successful completion of 24 credit hours, including 21 credit hours of required coursework and three credit hours of approved electives. The proposed revisions would decrease program length to 21 credit hours by eliminating one required course, *ACC 315 Accounting for Health Care Organizations*. This course is no longer needed as students complete sufficient accounting courses as part of the Business Core required for the BBA and BSBA degrees. In addition, the courses from which students choose the 3 credit hours in electives have been changed to concentrate more on program-specific courses which have been developed since the current curriculum was proposed. The current and proposed curriculum for the major is the same for the BBA and BSBA programs. The proposed new curriculum is as follows:

### Health Management and Policy Major

- Required courses (18 credit hours):
  - BSL 460 Health Care Law and Ethics (3 credit hours)
  - BTE 450 Introduction to Health Informatics (3 credit hours)
  - HSM 270/ Introduction to Health Sector Management and Policy (3 credit hours)
  - o HSM 310 Population Health (3 credit hours)
  - HSM 350 Production and Consumption of Health and Health Care (3 credit hours)
  - MKT 388 Health Care Marketing (3 credit hours)
    - or MGT 270 Introduction to Health Sector Organization And Management (3 credit hours)
- Electives (3 credit hours from the following):
  - o HSM 498 Special Topics in Health Sector Management & Policy (3 credit hours)
  - o HSM 499 Special Topics in Health Sector Management & Policy (3 credit hours)

- o POL 536 U.S. Health Care Crisis: Politics and Policies (3 credit hours)
- o SOC 321 Applied Health Policy (3 credit hours)
- SOC 351 Business and Society (3 credit hours)

The current minor requires 12 credit hours including nine credit hours in required courses and three credit hours in electives. The proposed changes would not change the length of the minor but will reduce required courses to six credit hours and increase electives to six credit hours. The proposed new curriculum is as follows:

#### Health Sector Management and Policy Major

- Required courses (6 credit hours):
  - HSM 270 Introduction to Health Sector Management and Policy (3 credit hours)
    - or MGT 270 Introduction to Health Sector Organization and Management (3 credit hours)
  - o HSM 350 Production and Consumption of Health and Health Care (3 credit hours)
- Electives (6 credit hours from the following):
  - o BSL 460 Health Care Law and Ethics (3 credit hours)
  - HSM 310 Population Health (3 credit hours)
  - HSM 498 Special Topics in Health Sector Management & Policy (3 credit hours)
  - HSM 499 Special Topics in Health Sector Management & Policy (3 credit hours)
  - o MKT 388 Health Care Marketing (3 credit hours)
  - o POL 536 U.S. Health Care Crisis: Politics and Policies (3 credit hours)
  - SOC 321 Applied Health Policy (3 credit hours)
  - SOC 351 Business and Society (3 credit hours)

The proposed revisions do not "represent a significant departure, either in content or method of delivery" from what we are currently approved by SACSCOC to offer due to the following:

- The revisions constitute changes to less than 25% of the curriculum and are not significant in terms of program content.
- The overall program length for the revised BBA and BSBA programs are unchanged and meet the SACSCOC requirement of a minimum of 120 credit hours.
- The BBA and BSBA continue to require a general education component that meets SACSCOC requirements.
- No new courses will be created for the proposed revisions.
- The revised major/minor will be supported by current qualified faculty.
- The proposed revisions do not involve a change in modality.
- The programs will continue to be offered on the Coral Gables campus.

SACSCOC only requires notification of program changes that represent a significant departure from our current programs. Therefore, no notification to or approval from SACSCOC is required for this change.
