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## Faculty Senate Budget and Compensation Committee

### 2019 Salary Comparison Report

#### Committee Guidelines

The BUDGET AND COMPENSATION COMMITTEE represents the faculty in the development of the budget of the University. Through regular and timely meetings with the Provost and others involved in the budget process, the committee shall be an active participant in the development of the budget at every stage at which key decisions are made so as to communicate to the **administration and to the Board of Trustees the faculty's perspective on such issues as long range budgetary policies, large scale expenditures, faculty salary increases and fringe benefits, including group insurance programs, retirement, tuition benefits and other benefits that are part of the compensation of the faculty.** The chair or co-chairs of the committee will act as liaison representative(s) to the University Budget Committee, and the Chair shall serve as an *ex officio* non-voting member of the Academic Standards Committee. The Faculty Senate Chair shall be an *ex officio* non-voting member. One of the four Employee Benefits Advisory Council representatives appointed by the Faculty Senate shall be designated to serve *ex officio* on the Budget and Compensation Committee.

#### Committee Activities

Since 2005, the Budget and Compensation Committee has compared salaries at the University of Miami (UM) with those at the US-based, member institutions of the Association of American Universities (AAU), both public and private, with a particular focus on ten peer private universities in the group. The University of Miami has utilized information on these same universities (Brandeis, Carnegie-Mellon, Case Western Reserve, Emory, NYU, Syracuse, Rochester, Tulane, USC, and Vanderbilt) for various planning purposes with budgetary

implications. Although Syracuse withdrew from the AAU in 2011, they remain on the comparison list for purposes of continuity and consistency. Boston University joined the AAU in 2012 and was added to the UM's comparison group in place of Syracuse; we now include Boston University in our list.

The committee examines faculty salaries as reported by the annual AAUP Faculty Compensation Survey, which is the largest independent source of data on full-time faculty salary and benefits at two- and four-year colleges and universities in the United States. The 2018 iteration of the survey includes information on salary and benefits for more than 380,000 faculty members. **Appendix A** includes data going back to the 2005-2006 academic year and extending annually through 2017-2018. Average salaries at the Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Full Professor levels are given for each US-based AAU member institution along with those of UM. (Salaries at medical schools are excluded from the data.) The absolute difference between the overall AAU mean (for public member institutions, private member institutions, and the entire combined AAU membership) and the UM mean are tracked year by year for each faculty rank. We also track the UM mean for each rank as a percentage of the corresponding overall AAU mean. **Appendix B** gives the same information but only for the focus years of 2007-2008, 2012-2013 and 2017-2018. **Appendix C and D** contain the corresponding data for UM and the eleven AAU peer schools.

Our first group of charts address comparisons with the combined public and private members of the AAU, again, across all ranks and for the academic years 2007-2008, 2012-2013 and 2017-2018. Our second group of charts highlights the comparisons with the included AAU peer institutions across all ranks for the academic years 2007-2008, 2012-2013 and 2017-2018.

This year we have included additional information in relation to the peer comparison group. **Appendix E** shows an adjustment of peer schools mean salaries for 2017-2018 for cost of living using the well-regarded Sperling's Best Places.

### **Conclusions**

1. The data with respect to the peer group is consistent across ranks. After having achieved the basic goal of parity with the mean of these institutions in both 2015-2016 and 2016-2017, the data for 2017-2018 show a relative decline
2. We show the same pattern with respect to the combined public and private membership of the AAU. We continue to run considerably ahead of the public institutions by themselves and considerably behind the full complement of private institutions.
3. We attribute these phenomena to the effects of two years of a merit faculty and staff pool of 2 %.

4. After adjusting salaries at peer institutions so that each dollar of salary is equivalent to Miami in terms of purchasing power, we see that UM salaries are only 83-84% of peer institutions. This is because most of the selected peer institutions are situated in areas with a relatively low SPERLING Cost-of-Living (COLA). This is also deterioration versus 2018 (about 90% of peers), as the cost of living increased in Miami by more than 8 of 11 peer institutions in 2019. This trend will significantly affect faculty recruitment and retention.

### **Recommendation**

The data suggest that the effort to attain compensation equality with the selected peer AAU institutions is still a work in progress and that we have and will lose ground with a merit pool of 2%. Our recommendation is that sustained attention be brought to the mutual Senate and Administration goal of obtaining and maintaining compensation equality with the selected peer AAU institutions. We recognize that parity is a moving target, not a static goal, and that it is subject to many factors outside our immediate control. This year's 3% faculty and staff merit pool plus 0.5% faculty adjustment pool is a step in the right direction. However, we do not mean to suggest that a 3 percent pool is sufficient to achieve parity or that it is sufficient to permit the University to address existing inequities in the current compensation of individuals within various departments. Indeed, peer institutions at the full professor level have averaged increases of 2.7% over the last 3 years. Therefore, if trends at peer universities continue, even increases of 3.5% per year will only achieve parity at the full professor level after 5 years.

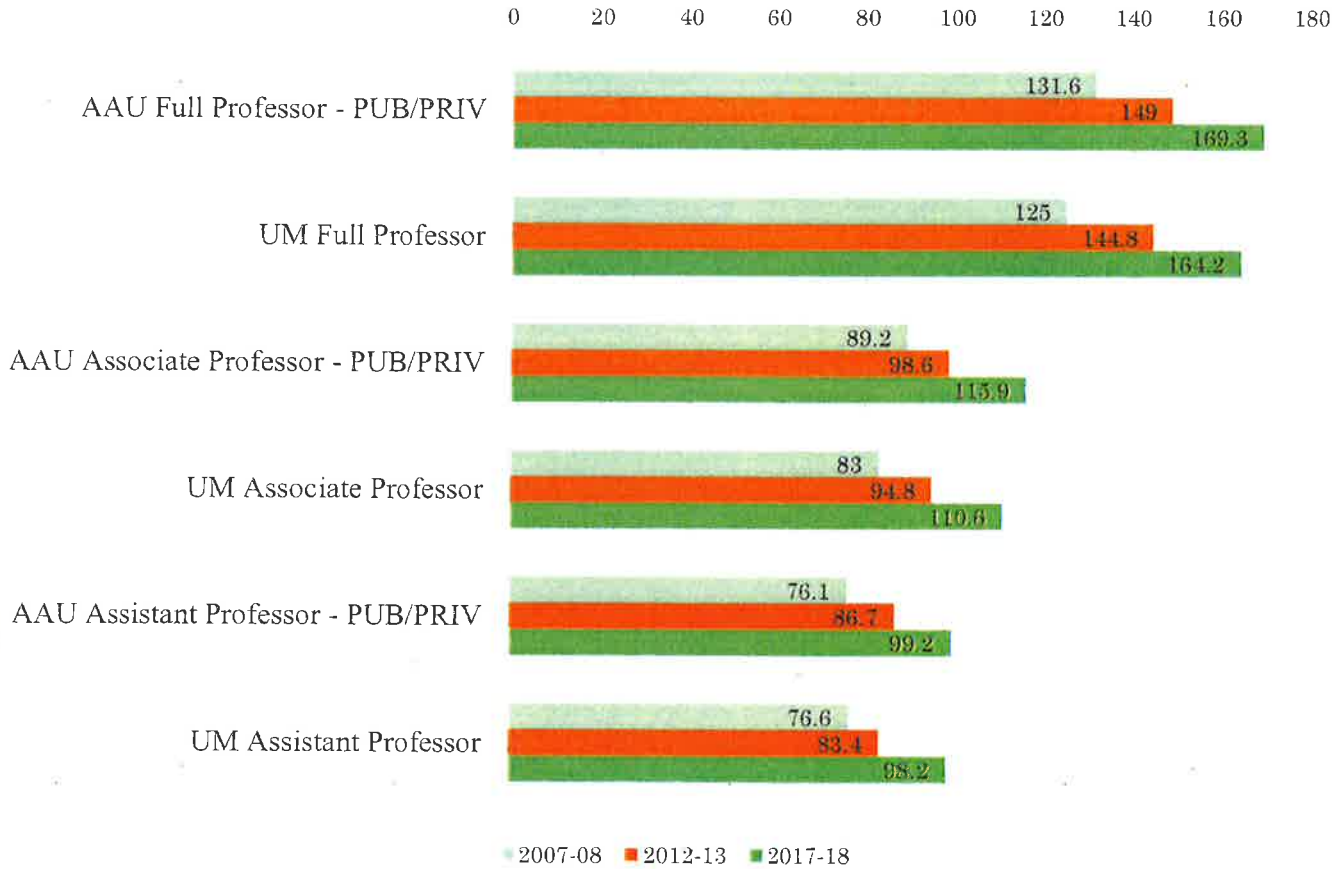

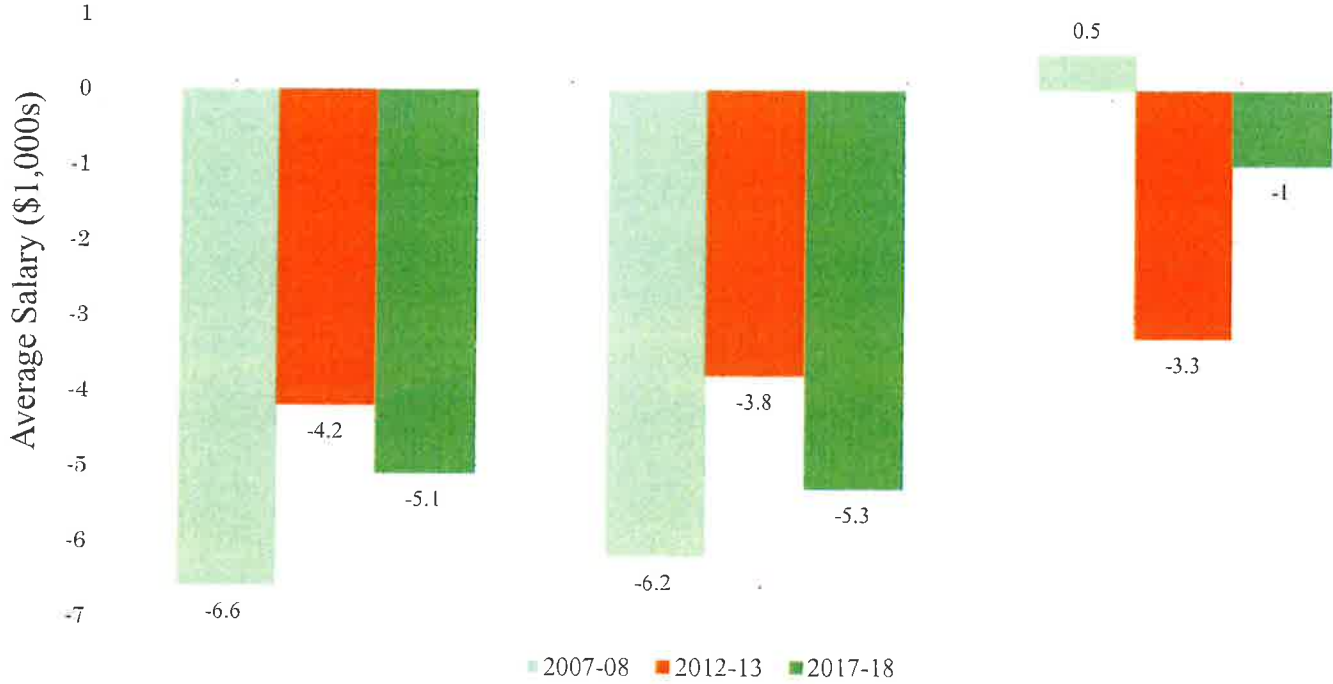

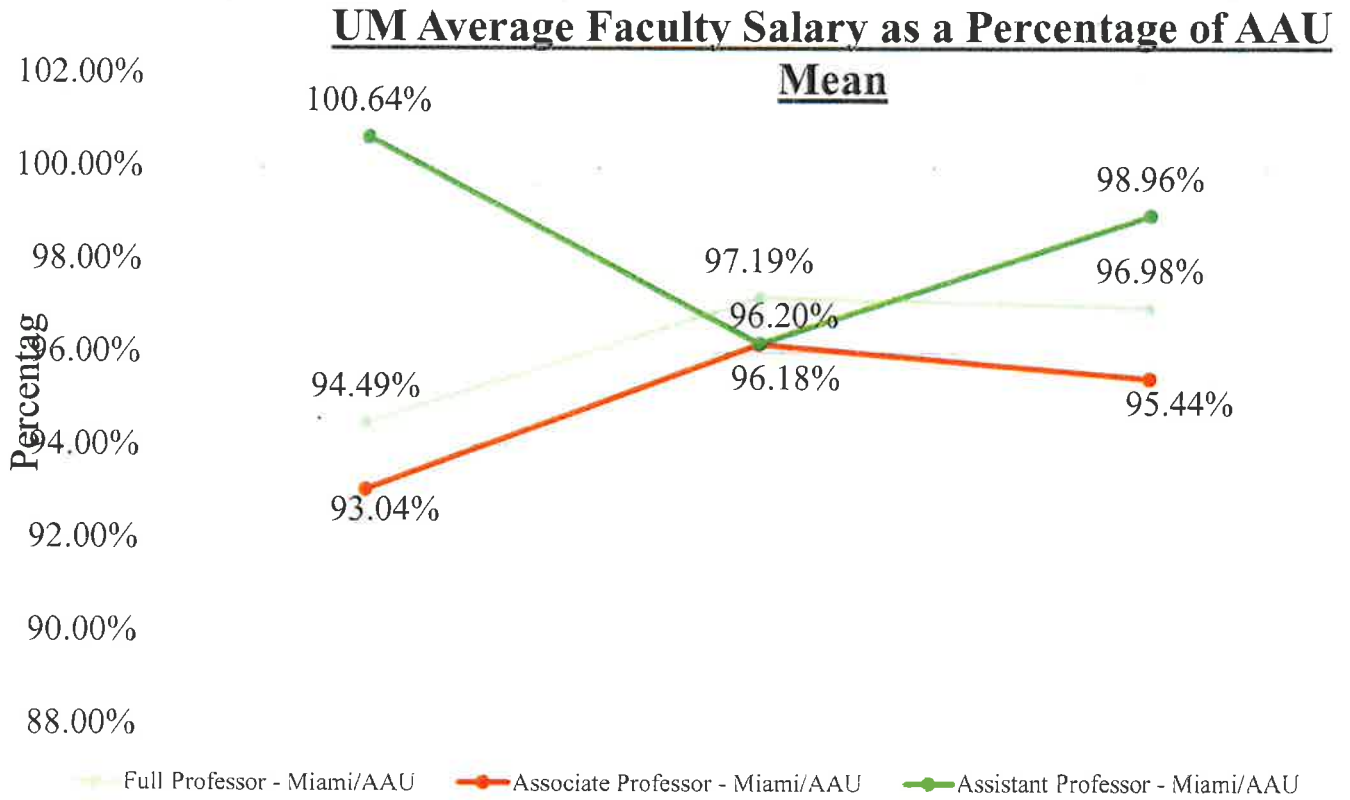

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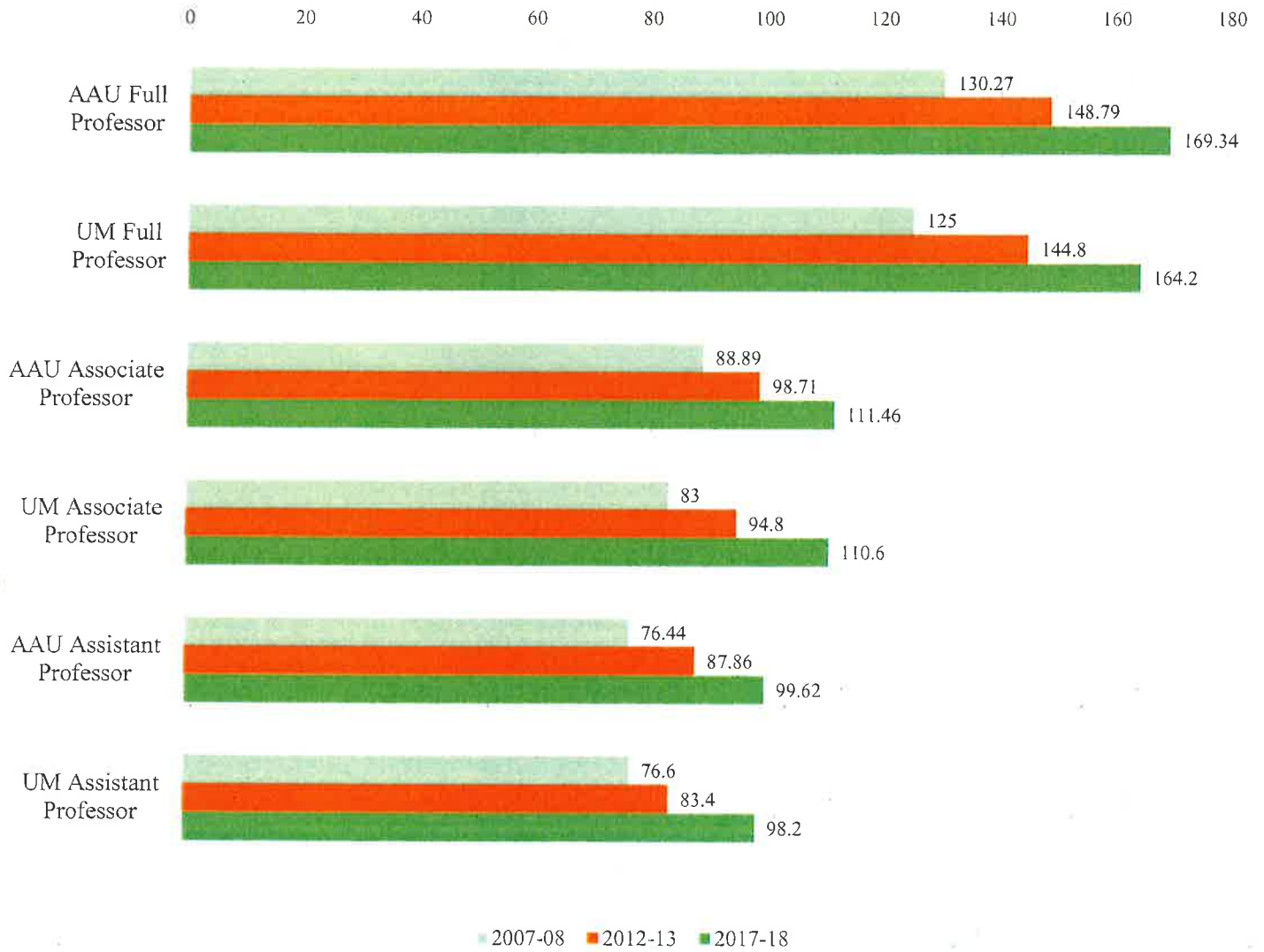

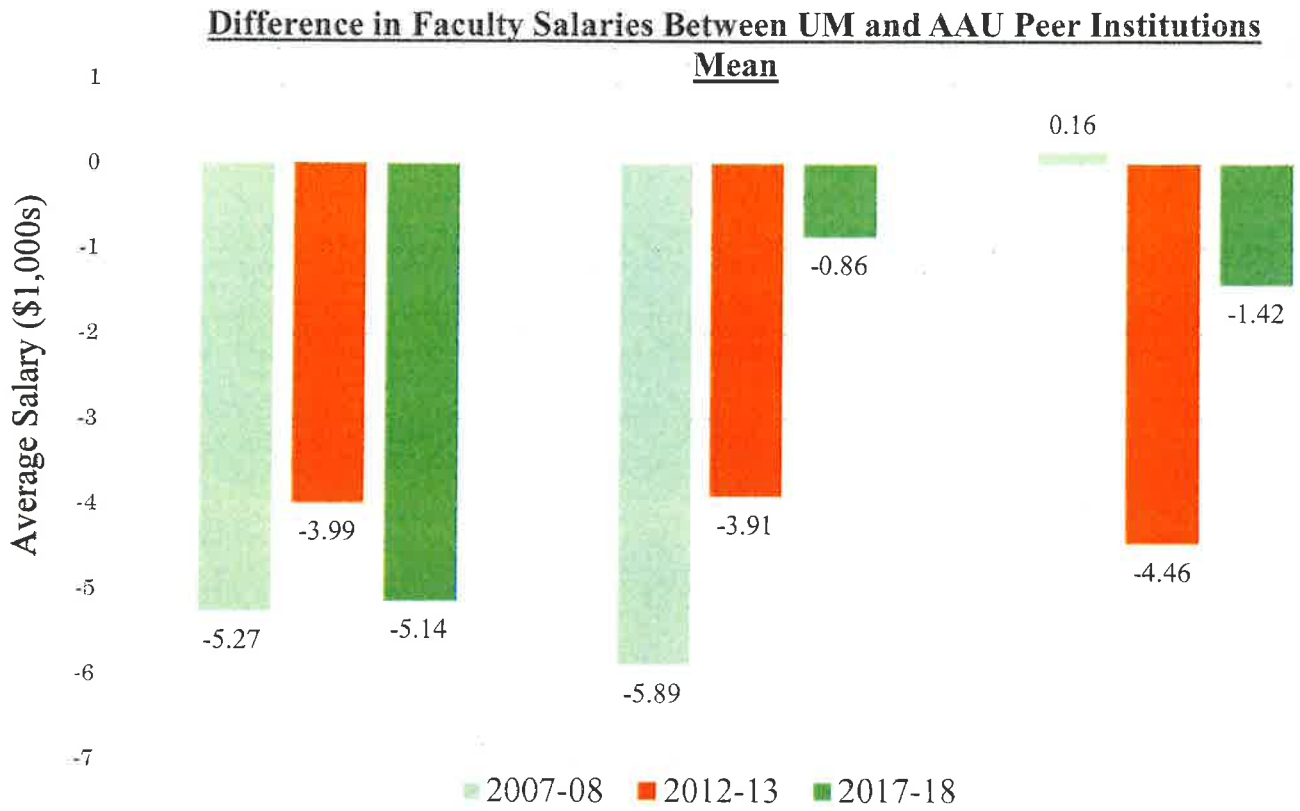

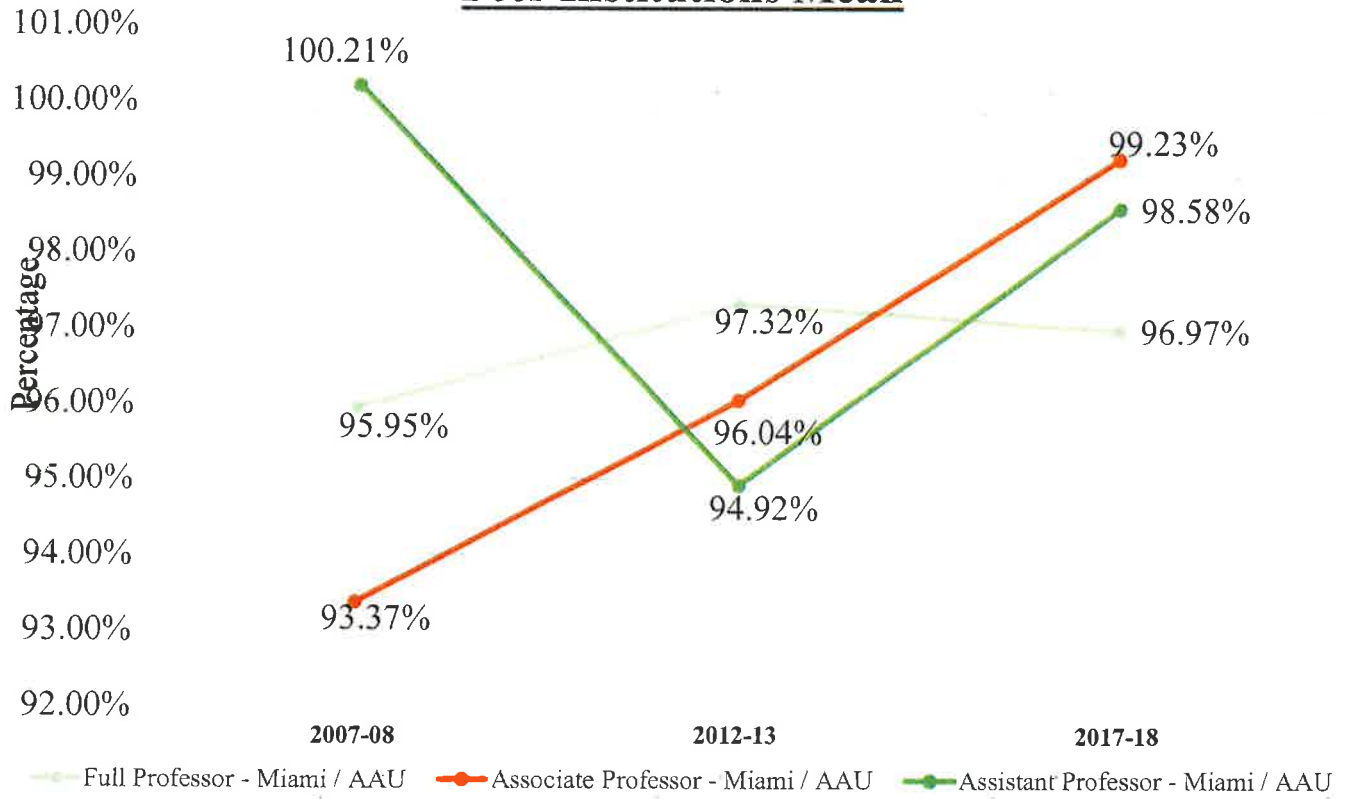
