**Program Overview** 

The University of Miami's College of Arts & Sciences offers a joint M.D./Master of Arts in International Administration (MAIA) degree program in partnership with the Miller School of Medicine.

The MD/MAIA curriculum includes a Certificate in Security Management, which is designed to prepare students to meet the various multidimensional security challenges that have faced our planet in the last two decades: from the aftermath of 9/11 to the most recent crisis of COVID-19. For future physicians, understanding the sociocultural and geopolitical threats posed by violent human actions, natural disasters, and pandemics, is essential. Transformational leadership in times of acute crisis demands a unique array of insights and skills.

The MD/MAIA program is grounded in an academic, theoretical, understanding of security problems and emergency management strategies. It also emphasizes the development of the practitioner's arts within the strategic, tactical and operational realms of international security administration.

**Program Mission Statement** 

The Dual MD/Master of Arts in International Administration (MD/MAIA) with a Certificate in Security Management will provide MD students to address the multidimensional challenges that confront modern, global institutions, including international affairs, geopolitics, security, disaster management, and human resilience. The NextGenMD curriculum, in partnership with the MAIA program, strives to empower learners to transform lives and inspire learners to serve the global community. The curriculum will produce transformational leaders who will shape the future of medicine, direct health systems, and champion discovery and its translation into clinical interventions.

Students in the joint MD/MAIA program engage with the considerations of politics and culture, as well as those of economics and management in order to develop the skills necessary to work with people in multiple contexts and environments. These include:

Local, state and federal governmental agencies

Regional and international organizations

National and international public health-care management organizations

Non-profit public service organizations

Global relief and charitable groups

Civil society movements

Corporate and financial concerns

Emergency management organizations

**Program Goals** 

The MD/MAIA program's goal is to provide a scholarly concentration to satisfy the NextGenMD's personalized curriculum through a dual degree program. MD/MAIA students will have the opportunity to study social and cultural determinants of health in a global context through MAIA coursework and the required thesis.

**Student Learning Outcomes** 

### MD Program

Students will demonstrate master of biomedical knowledge (i.e., anatomy, biochemistry, immunology, etc.) required to practice clinical medicine.

Students will demonstrate clinical skills proficiency, such as performing a complete physical examination. Student competency in performing a physical examination and in clinical skills is evaluated by student performance on end of year 1 and 2 competency exercises.

Students will demonstrate application of knowledge and skills to clinical decision-making and the practice of medicine, including formulating differential diagnoses, and a diagnostic and therapeutic plan. Student competency in organizing clinical data, synthesizing clinical information and formulating management plans is demonstrated by performance on the United States Medical Licensing Step 2 Clinical Skills Examination.

### **MAIA Program**

Students will demonstrate knowledge of the subject-matter, the topic, at the center of their Practicum Report. This involves an understanding of the functional and organizational setting in which they served during their internship, the broader political, cultural and economic context within which the internship site exists and the ability to abstract from their experience a specific topic for analysis to which students apply skills in critical analysis, problem-solving and written communications developed during their course of study.

Students will demonstrate critical thinking skills, a habit of mind characterized by the comprehensive exploration of issues, ideas, artifacts, and events before accepting or formulating an opinion or conclusion.

Students will demonstrate their skills in written communication, learning to work in many genres and styles. It can involve working with many different writing technologies, and mixing text, data and images.

# **Admission Requirements**

Students must first be accepted to the University of Miami's MD Program. First year MD students should then apply separately to the MAIA program through this process: Completed application for admission submitted through CollegeNet

Statement of purpose

A current resume

Official transcripts from each post-secondary institution attended (may be duplicates from the student's MD application)

An official TOEFL or IELTS score is required as proof of English proficiency for international applicants who did not receive a degree in the United States or a foreign country where English is the primary language. The following minimum score is required for admission to a graduate business degree program.

TOEFL - 94 or above (iBT only)

IELTS - 7.0 or above

Upon receipt of the student's application, an admissions interview will be scheduled with the MAIA director or another designee from the MAIA program.

## **Rationale**

#### Rationale

In May 2019, Miller School of Medicine Dean Henri R. Ford, issued a bold challenge to the faculty of the Medical School to imagine a multi-phase redesign of the M.D. curriculum, allowing students to develop a personalized pathway in a specialized area of interest, consisting of scholarly or joint degree pursuits.

To that end, the College of Arts & Sciences (A&S) was approached to consider dual degree options for medical students that align with the NextGenMD mission to empower learners to transform lives and serve the global community. The Master of Arts in International Administration (MAIA) has a rich history of collaboration with various Medical School faculty who frequently guest lecture to MAIA classes on topics of emergency management, disaster relief, and humanitarian assistance. In addition, MAIA students participated in UM's inaugural humanitarian disaster response course created by Humanitarian U and facilitated by the School of Nursing and Health Studies (SONHS) and the Miller School's Gordon Center for Research in Medical Education and Global Institute for Community Health and Development.

Market Demand

Students in this program will come from the existing MD cohort. Dual MD/Master's programs are increasing in popularity and offering at our peer and aspiring-peer institutions. The Association of American Medical Colleges offers a complete list of medical schools with combined degree programs.

MAIA itself is unique among graduate degrees that prepare students for the operational and managerial aspects of security, sustainability, and geopolitics. MAIA alumni currently work for: CDC, WHO, American Oncology Network, American Red Cross, Refugee Assistance Alliance, Non-profit organizations, and Multi-national organizations.

Relationship to Other Programs

There are several existing joint degree programs within the College of Arts & Sciences and the Miller School of Medicine, including dual and joint MD/Masters options as part of the NextGenMD curriculum. Relevant existing programs include:

In addition to this proposal, the College of Arts & Sciences and the Miller School of Medicine are collaborating on a joint MD/Certificate in Security Management (for students who do not wish to complete a full Master's degree) and a joint MD/Master of Arts in Medical Humanities (new degree). These proposals are forthcoming.

It is projected that 10-15 students per cohort will elect to add the MD/MAIA joint degree option as their scholarly concentration pathway.

The MD/MAIA program will be supported through MAIA tuition returns and the additional \$20,000 in medical school tuition that will be paid by dual degree students. An MOU between the College of Arts & Sciences and the Medical School has been executed and will be reviewed and revised by the Deans of each school every three years.
